James F. Donnelly, M.D. University of Louisville, 1900; of Brooklyn; for several years surgeon on the Ward, Cunará and Hamburg-American lines and once chief health officer for the Haytian Republic; for three years a member of the staff of the health officer of the Port of New York; who went to Belgium with the first American National Red Cross unit and after his return to this country, returned to Europe in November, 1914, as director of one of the Servian units; died in Nish, Servia, February 24, from typhoid fever, aged 45.
